Belgium's Victor Hugo Stéphane slides smoothly around the hairpin. He glances back to see Orsi's Maserati cut across the turn in a bid to close the gap – and another car – a white Bugatti!! Ah!! It is Hegkman!! He shifts down, but his brakes fail him! Out of control, he careens into the hairpin. Rychly cuts left to avoid an impact. France too downshifts and holds to the outside.  \* = Stop in Curve (example: \*\*\* = Three Stops Completed at End of Round)
